This week in Church we are considering the Parable of the unmerciful servant found in Matthew 18.21-35. It would be good for us to remember just as we are called to forgive one another as often and as much is needed, we are also called to love one another patiently and tirelessly even when we are irritable and tired. Let us continue to welcome Christ into our lives and discipline us in the patience, tolerance and love of one another. God bless.


